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29 Low Cost or Rapidly Implemented Accessibility Features

- 1. Re-stripe faded accessible parking spaces and access aisles.
- 2. Paint contrast striping on exterior stairs.
- 3. Move planters, trash cans, bicycle racks and other items away from entry doors.
- 4. Trim overhanging tree limbs to maintain 80" vertical clearance.
- 5. Trim vegetation reducing the clear width of walks and sidewalks.
- 6. Grind vertical breaks in walks to >1/2" high.
- Identify all accessible entrances with the International Symbol of Accessibility (ISA). If all
 entrances are not accessible, provide signage indicating the location of the accessible
 building entrance.
- 8. Adjust door closers (5 pounds maximum for interior/exterior doors, up to 15 pounds for required fire doors).
- 9. Install information at building directories indicating the location of accessible restrooms and elevators.
- Post information at entrances to inaccessible restrooms indicating the location of nearest accessible restroom
- 11. Install <u>fixed</u> trash receptacles in restrooms. Locate receptacles away from toilets, sinks and other accessible features.
- 12. Install pull handles on the interior and exterior of accessible toilet compartments.
- 13. Insulate the supply and drain lines under sinks and lavatories.
- 14. Check the maintenance on all accessibility features such as automatic doors, wheelchair lifts, elevators; toilet seats (check for stability) grab bars, insulation under lavatories, etc.
- 15. Activate (if deactivated) audible indicators in elevators for direction and floor indication.
- 16. Keep trash receptacles, etc. away from elevator hall call buttons.
- 17. If two-way communication systems on elevators are located behind an access panel, make sure that the hardware is operational without tight grasping and pulling.
- 18. Place planters or other fixed objects under displays or other elements projecting from walls more than 4", between 27" and 80" high.
- Post information on the availability of Assistive Listening Devices (ALD's) at all performance or assembly venues.

- 20. Relocate professor and faculty in-boxes and message areas so within maximum front or side reach ranges for students with mobility impairments.
- 21. Relocate furniture in common use areas such as lounges, dining areas, to maintain accessible routes of travel.
- 22. Identify accessible tables with the ISA.
- 23. Check the operation of lifts at swimming pools. Make sure lifts are available and staff trained on use.
- 24. List the California Relay Service (CRS) number (711) on promotional materials. Train staff in using the relay service and post the CRS number by staff telephones
- 25. Run a third party analysis program (such as Bobby) on company website to identify and correct problems to make material accessible to individuals with visual disabilities.
- 26. Have presentation or program materials available in digital format.
- Inform staff how to contact sign language or Computer Aided Real Time (CART) Interpreters if requested.
- 28. Activate captioning at televisions and other AV displays.
- 29. Remove or modify any signs stating "no dogs allowed" or "no animals allowed" to except service animals.
